### Important notes about FOOD - please read and respond!

- ◆ The pub is about 15 minute walk from the accommodation. You might wish to bring a **torch** as it is a bit dark on some parts of the walk.

#### **By Car:**

**From Southampton direction** Fairthorne Manor is just 10 minutes off the M27. Come off the motorway at Junction 7 and follow the signs for Hedge End and Botley. Go straight through Botley village square, and follow the road ahead for about 200 metres. Take the next turning on the right - this is the A3051 to Titchfield, and is also signposted for YMCA. Go past the Pinkmead Farm Shop, and about 150 metres further on, take the second driveway on the right.

**From Portsmouth direction** Come off the motorway at Junction 9 and take the A27 towards Segensworth. At the next roundabout turn right following the A27 towards Bursledon for  $\frac{1}{2}$  a mile. At Park Gate turn right on to the A3051 to Botley, which is signposted for YMCA. Continue for 2 miles passing through the villages of Swanwick, Burr ridge and Curbridge. After the Horse & Jockey pub on the left continue for  $\frac{3}{4}$  of a mile. Just as the road dips down, the turning for the YMCA is on the left.

#### **By Train:**

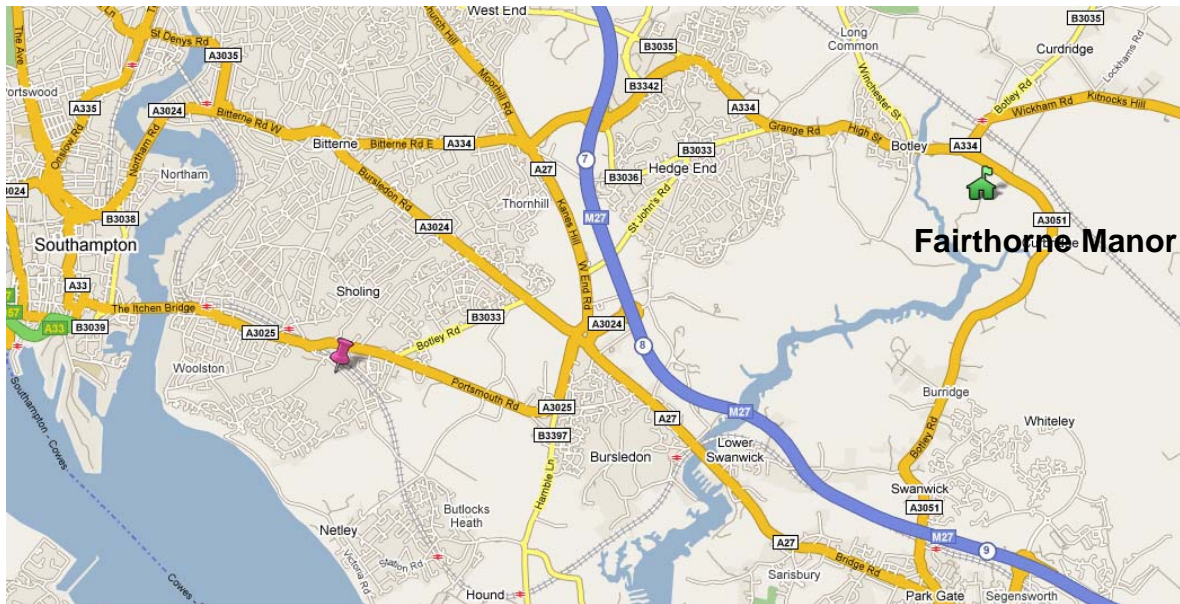
Fairthorne Manor is about half a mile from Botley station. Coming out of the station, turn right following the main road towards Botley, and then take the first left onto the A3051 to Titchfield, which is also signposted for YMCA. Go past the Pinkmead Farm Shop, and about 150 metres further on, take the first driveway on the right.
